Miller was established in 1887 and became Miller Compressing Company in 1903. They are a scrap processor located in the Menomonee Valley. The process and sell over 1,000,000 tons of ferrous scrap around over 250,000,000 pounds of nonferrous scrap annually, which generates about \$350,000,000 in revenue. They receive industrial scrap from more than 600 businesses in Southeast Wisconsin and Northern Illinois. In 2006, Miller Compressing Company achieved certification of compliance with ISO Standard 9001:2000 for quality. 14001:2004 for environmental compliance and OHSAS 18001:2002 for safety. Very few companies in the United States have achieved all three certifications. These certifications confirm that they have a continuously improving management system, with the controls in place to offer a quality product in an environmentally sound and safe work environment.
